God Is Exalted in Psalm 76

1. God’s name and place of dwelling are clearly manifested by His overwhelming crushing of the weapons of war brandished against His people. Our bearing Christ’s name and our being the residence of God’s Holy Spirit are evidence that any threats to our salvation have likewise been thoroughly vanquished.
2. God’s majesty is glorious, far beyond that of the most symbolic expression of a fulfilling existence. Those most likely to acquire a satisfying life through their strength and skills lie sleeping with useless faculties in comparison to Him.
3. The God of Jacob, when His anger is provoked, rightly strikes fear in the hearts of those whose god is not the LORD, seeing that they and their symbols of strength lie stupefied in His presence.
4. God’s judgment from heaven silences His foes, even using their wrath to bring Him glory, as He rescues the humble of the earth while His foes' rage becomes a garland for Him.
5. Reverence and fear and bringing offerings of time, talents, and treasures is the appropriate response to such a God. All others are left with only fear of Him.
