For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit.







"...For Fear of the Jews"

Making Sense of the Relationship Between the Jews & the Church Throughout the Fourth Gospel, John brings out the growing opposition to the

Kingdom of God by "the Jews." The evangelist records some exceptionally clear statements of Jesus regarding the Jews, perhaps most poignantly in John 8 in which Jesus says to the Jews: You are of your father the devil, and your will is to do your

father's desires. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him... (John 8:44). As such John's Gospel is often accused of being "anti-semitic" because of the way in which it highlights the ferocious hostility of the Jews to God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

But the assertion that John, a semite, was antisemitic is absurd; he was a Jew. One of the metivating factors for John's writing is to inflame Christian goal to bring the

of the motivating factors for John's writing is to inflame Christian zeal to bring the gospel of Christ to the Jews, to call them to faith and repentance and to embrace the offspring of Abraham who alone brings blessing to all the families of the earth.

One of the reasons John highlights both the hostility of the Jews and the clear statements of Jesus is to emphasize one cannot remain merely a Jew in order to enter the Kingdom of God, but one must come to God through Christ.

POLITICAL CONCERNS: Christian Support for the Jewish State

In recent decades a false teaching has crept into the Church that Christians have a biblical imperative to support the Jews or even the Jewish State because God has a special purpose for the Jews alongside the Church. This new doctrine is especially curious given that there was no Jewish State prior to the declaration of such in 1948. We ought to approach any new ideas with great skepticism.

Nonetheless, Christians do have a duty to reject antisemitism and hatred, abuse, and/or discrimination of all people on the basis of their ethnicity. Recent acts of terror and violence by Muslims directed toward the Jews should enflame our sympathy toward the Jews as our neighbors. But whether Christians support the Jewish State is a separate, political question: there is no biblical mandate.

BIBLICAL BALANCE: The Israel of God

The status of the Jews and the duty or relationship of the Church to the physical descendants of Jacob is complicated and requires some nuance, but can be summarized under four points.

First: There is no future for Israel outside of the Lord Jesus Christ. The True Israel, the "Israel of God" is all those who have been made new creations in Christ regardless of ancestry or family makeup (Gal. 6:15-16).

Second: The Jews are not friends of the Church nor do they have a special relationship with God. While the Jews are our neighbors (Luke 10:36), as regards the gospel, the Jews are "enemies" (Rom 11:28), since they refuse to submit to Christ.

Third: Those who refuse to come to Christ are not really "Jews" in anything but name and "not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel" (Rom 9:6), but in fact are a "synagogue of Satan" (Rev. 2:9, cf. John 8:44ff). Belonging to an ethnic group or family was never a sufficient basis for approaching God (Lev. 10) even though "salvation is from the Jews" (John 4:22).

Fourth: The day is coming when the Jews will be so characterized by vibrant faith in Christ, since "the gifts and calling of God are irrevocable" (Rom 11:29). And on that day "all Israel will be saved" (Rom 11:26). That day will be glorious and like a resurrection from the dead (Rom 11:15).

EVANGELISM: The Church's Duty


There are many issues in current events regarding the Jewish State and the Jews and those questions may be left to political pundits to answer and Christians must weigh such matters with Christian prudence. But the Scripture is unequivocally clear that there is no biblical imperative for God's people to support a homeland for the Jews or show any preference to the Jews over other ethnic groups much less that God has a special, separate destiny for the Jews apart from Christ's Church.

The Scripture is equally clear the Church's duty toward the Jews is to call them to faith and repentance in Christ, to embrace the advantages (Rom 3:1) they have from God which all find their culmination in Jesus, the Son of David and Son of God who was crucified by Pontius Pilate for our sins and raised for our justification on the third day, in accordance with the Scriptures (Rom 4:25, I Cor 15:4-5).
